

VOTER IDENTIFICATION AT THE POLLS

Every voter is required to show proof of identity at the polling place before receiving a ballot. This is a result of Proposition 200, the statewide initiative approved by voters in 2004.

ACCEPTABLE IDENTIFICATION

1. **PHOTO identification with voter's name and address - ONE REQUIRED**

- Valid Arizona driver's license
- Valid Arizona non-operating identification license
- Tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal identification
- Valid United States federal, state or local government issued identification

----OR----

2. **NON-PHOTO identification with voter's name and address - TWO REQUIRED**

- Utility bill dated within ninety (90) days of the election. A utility bill may be for electric, gas, water, solid waste, sewer, telephone, cellular phone or cable TV.
- Bank or credit union statement dated within ninety (90) days of the election.
- Valid Arizona Vehicle Registration
- Indian Census Card
- Property Tax Statement of the voter's residence
- Tribal Enrollment Card or other form of tribal identification
- Vehicle Insurance Card
- Voter Registration Card or Recorder's Certificate
- Valid United States federal, state or local government
- Any "Official Election Material" mailing bearing the voter's name and address

PROVISIONAL BALLOT

If the voter does not have acceptable identification at the polling place, a Provisional Ballot can be voted. Acceptable identification must then be presented to the Town Clerk or the Maricopa County Recorder by 5:00 p.m. the Friday after the election.
